ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- A graduating high school senior with a minimum unweighted 3.0 GPA
- College-bound high school senior.
- Applicants must be involved in community service.

SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION:

The Scholarship will be awarded, based on the following criteria:

- Grade Point Average: Verified by **<u>Official Transcript</u>** (sealed) attached to application.
- Community Service and School Activities
- The essay should be **250 500 words**, using the American Psychological Association (APA) format for an 8 1/2x11 document.
- Explain your Goals and Future Career Plans in 60 words or less on a separate sheet.
- Content, grammar, punctuation, and spelling will be judged.
- Recommendations: The applicant must submit <u>two letters of recommendation</u>. The first letter should be from your high school teacher, counselor or principal. The second from a community leader, employer, coach, or other professionals.
- Neatness/presentation
- Recent photograph head and shoulders, appropriate for newspaper release.

Essay Requirements: Applicants must submit an essay that addressed the following statement:

The African American men who trained at Montford Point Camp are considered trailblazers within the United States Marine Corps. What educational and career aspirations do you have that will impact others and how has the history of the Montford Point Marine influenced you?

- Typeface: The preferred typeface is Times New Roman, 12-point font size.
- Line spacing: Double-space between all text lines of the essay. Double-space after every line in the title, headings, footnotes, quotations, references, and figure captions.
- Margins: Leave uniform margins of at least 1 inch at the top, bottom, left, and right of every page.
- Alignment: Do not justify lines; that is, adjust the spacing between words to make all lines the same length. Instead, use the flush-left style, and leave the right margin uneven, or ragged.
- Paragraphs: Indent the first line of every paragraph and the first line of every footnote. For consistency, use the tab key, which should be set at five to seven spaces, or ½ inch.
- Order of Essay: (Page 1) "Title" which contains the title of the essay, running head, author byline, and current institution. (Page 2 and beyond) is the body of the 250 500-word essay.

NOTE: To be eligible for consideration, ALL requested documents MUST be included in your package and all guidelines MUST be met. Please submit only the requested documents.

Ensure you read and adhere to all guidelines before you complete and email your completed package to <u>scholaratlmpma@gmail.com</u> on or before **Monday**, **March 18, 2024**.

The scholarship committee will announce the recipient(s) in **April 2024** and the recipients will be recognized at our Chapter meeting on April 20, 2024 and at the school's Awards Night.
